**Conservation Lands Labourer - Seasonal**

**GENERAL DESCRIPTION:**

The Conservation Lands Labourer assists with delivery of Lower Trent Conservation's (LTC) Conservation Lands Program and, in particular, with general maintenance and operation of the Conservation Lands and facilities.

**KEY DUTIES:**

1. Provide high quality service to meet LTC, municipal, partner and public expectations.
2. Perform general labour as directed by the supervisor to assist with day-to-day maintenance and operation of the Conservation Lands and facilities.
3. Operate tools and equipment, under the direction of the supervisor, necessary to complete the assigned duties.
4. Assist with packaging and distribution of tree seedlings to the public.
5. Assist technical staff with the operation and maintenance of flood control structures, and flood emergency plans.
6. Adhere with all LTC policies and procedures.
7. Undertake other related duties as required, and as assigned by the supervisor or CAO.

**QUALIFICATIONS**

- Valid Ontario Class A driver's license
- Chainsaw certificate
- Ability to operate tractors, all terrain vehicles, chainsaw, woodworking equipment, trucks, groundskeeping equipment, etc.
- Physically fit – some lifting required
- Ability to work outdoors in adverse conditions required
- Ability to work with minimal supervision
- Ability to undertake and complete tasks as assigned
