





Notice of Public Information Centre - Colborne Creek Floodplain Mapping Update

The Project

Lower Trent Conservation is in the process of completing a study to update the existing regulatory floodplain for Colborne Creek in partnership with the Township of Cramahe and D.M. Wills Associates Limited. The study area is generally outlined in Figure 1.

The Process

The process to develop floodplain maps involves field investigations (topographic, bathymetric, and hydraulic structure surveys), a hydrology study (including hydrologic modelling, the development of a hydraulic model, the development of floodline maps, and documentation of the methodology and results from the study in a comprehensive report.
